Sequential golf, a step-by-step guide to the game for a lifetime. That's the name of the book Bill wrote, it's also the text for the golfing class at Saddleback College. Being in a position to teach golf and writing the text for the course at the college level is quite an accomplishment in itself. In addition to teaching golf he is the only head coach in California Community College history to have coached state championship teams in three different sports (football, men's golf and women's golf) in one year. What does that say about his achievement and drive?

He has received the "Men of Character" award from The Boy Scouts of America in recognition for his community activities. Having won three state championships in one year is quite something, but it is no fluke that his golf teams have won seven other state championships. He has served on the board of directors of the SCGA, been vice-president and president of the California Golf Association as well as being on the rules committee and board of directors.

"Bill Cunerty received his B.A. from the University of California and his M.A. from Cal State Dominguez Hills. While attending USC he was a two sport student-athlete, playing football and baseball under legendary coaches John McKay and Rod Dedeaux. Coaching high school football at his alma mater, North High School in Torrance then later at Dana Hills and again at Capistrano Valley, guess what, they all made CIF playoff appearances. Moving up to the JC program at Saddleback he helped lead them to both the conference championship and the next season to the National Championship. Named NCAA's National Junior College Coach of the Year in 1999. A partner in the West Coast Passing School attended by over 1,800 high school quarterbacks and receivers has been extremely rewarding in that six of his former students became first-round draft choices and 36 other players have gone on to careers in the NFL. "
